

## COMMUNICATION REGARDING CORONAVIRUS (COVID 19)

### Grand Haven CDD Residents:

The Grand Haven Community Development District continues to monitor Local, State and Federal communications, guidelines, recommendations and advisories regarding the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19).

In an effort to reduce the risk of spreading the virus, and consistent with the State of Florida guidance to minimize mass gatherings, the District has made the decision to suspend special events where larger crowds would typically be in attendance.

Effective this Friday, March 13, 2020 at 8:00 a.m., the District has decided to postpone events that would have the potential for larger gatherings of residents. This includes the Meet and Greet scheduled to be held tonight at the Village Center. Furthermore, the District will not be scheduling the Easter Egg Hunt and other spring related special events and programs. This suspension of events is expected to remain in effect through Friday, April 10<sup>th</sup>, 2020, or as further directed by the Board of Supervisors or Local, State or Federal agencies.

Currently all regular activities and daily routines at the recreational facilities will continue as normal and remain open. This includes the fitness center, and the swimming pools. Should situations change, District staff will notify you as soon as information becomes available.

As of this moment, there have not been reported cases within the District of which we are aware. Staff has nevertheless increased the daily cleanliness and sanitization efforts, and additional hand sanitizers and disinfectant wipes are placed throughout the recreational facilities. We respectfully request and encourage residents to wipe down equipment after each use and frequently wash your hands. All residents and their guests should stay home if you are ill or have come in contact with someone who is ill. Furthermore, consistent with CDC and Florida Department of Health guidance, and recognizing that spring break is upon us and many District residents may be enjoying vacations and travel within and outside the United States, the District is requesting the following:

Level 3: "CDC recommends 14-day, self-isolation and practice social distancing upon return to the United States. Social distancing includes avoiding going out in public and close personal interactions. If you become symptomatic, immediately self-isolate and contact your county health department or health care provider." As of today, China, Iran, Italy and South Korea are the countries with the Level 3 Health Notice.

Level 2 and Cruises: "Travelers should monitor your health and limit interactions with others for 14 days after returning to the United States. If you become symptomatic, immediately self-isolate and contact your county health department or health care provider."

To the extent you fall into one of these two categories, we ask that you follow those advisements and refrain from entering District facilities.

The District strives to balance the health and safety of residents while limiting the inconvenience and social disruptions caused to the community. As we continue to observe and follow the State and Federal recommendations, the Grand Haven CDD is also constantly monitoring the Flagler County Government and Flagler County School District, in order to determine the appropriate ongoing response from the District.

It is recommended that all residents and guests follow the basic infection prevention guidelines from the CDC, including washing hands often, avoiding contact with sick people, cleaning high-touch surfaces, and staying home when sick.
